Mother's Auxiliary Presents Gifts to 3 At Ceremony Here

Three former members of the K-W Sea Cadets, now on active service with the navy, were presented with gifts last night by the Mothers' Auxiliary of the Sea Cadet Corps at the "Warspite."

The Mothers' Auxiliary, formed a few months ago, is made up of mothers who have sons in the corps, and it has been their aim to provide a gift to all the boys when they join the active navy and also to look after the wants and even the luxuries of the boys while they are away.

One of the boys who received a gift, Bill Wolfhard, a midshipman in the original Sea Cadet Corps, has done remarkably well since joining the navy four months ago.

He headed his class at H.M.C.S. Star, Hamilton, and was promoted to the rank of acting leading seaman. He reports to H.M.C.S. York for a gunnery course Monday and on completion will be transferred back to H.M.C.S. Star to act as an instructor.

The rapid rise of this young sailor is taken as an indication that the sea cadet training is invaluable in the active navy.

Norman Hathaway and Jim Weston, both former Sea Cadets who are now stationed at H.M.C.S. York, received the other presentations. Mrs. M. L. Smith, mother of one of the Sea Cadets, and cousin of the commander who went down with the Jarvis Bay, tendered the gift on behalf of the Mothers' Auxiliary.

PRESENT BADGES

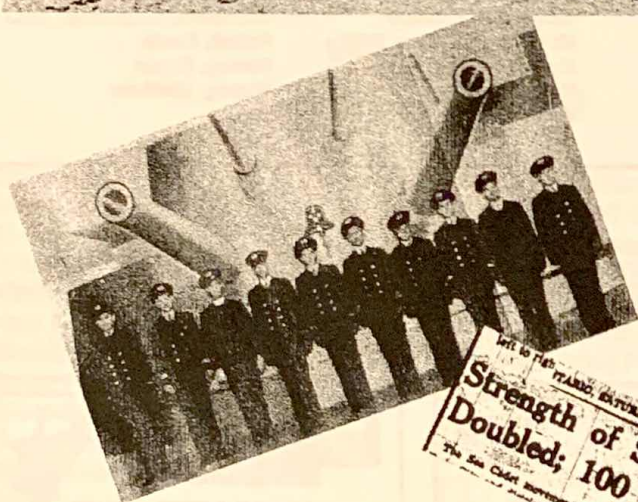
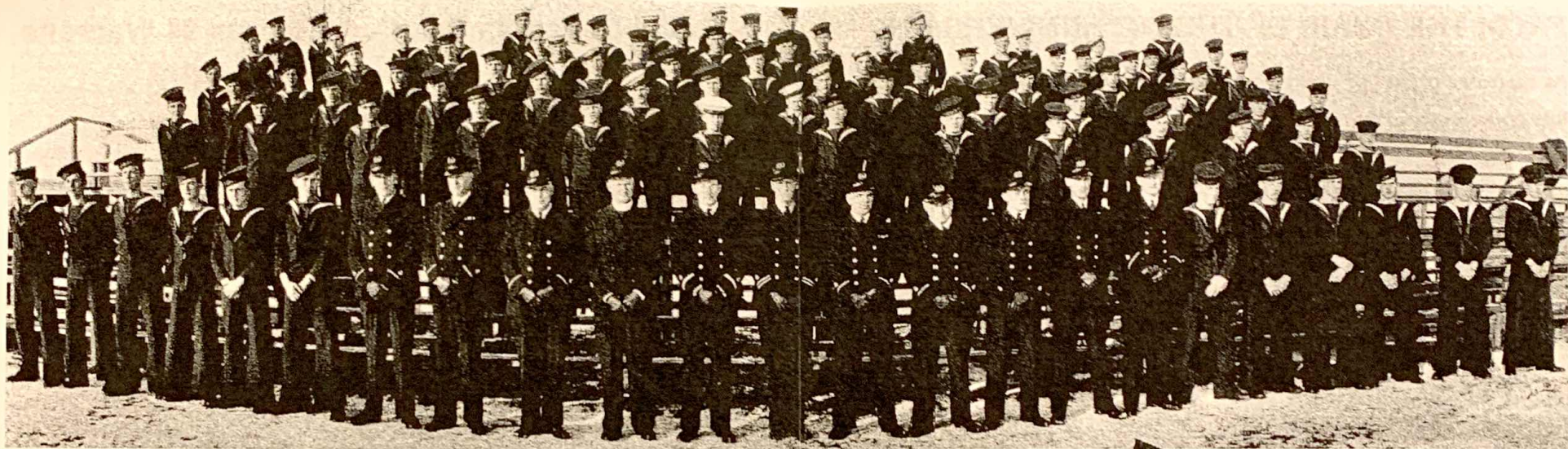
Good conduct badges, the highest award that a naval rating may receive outside of a decoration for bravery in service, were presented to 12 of the Sea Cadets last night. Lieut.-Commander J. McFetrick, area commander, of Hamilton, made the awards.

To earn a good conduct badge a cadet must have attended at least 75 parades during 12 calendar months. He has to be good in his studies and recommended by his divisional officer for the award. The only excuse for being absent that is accepted is the fact that the boy is either working in a war plant, sick, or at the Sea Cadet summer camp.

Leading Seaman Cliff Wilkie topped the group receiving the awards. During the 12-month period he didn't miss one of the 102 parades in which the Sea Cadets participated.

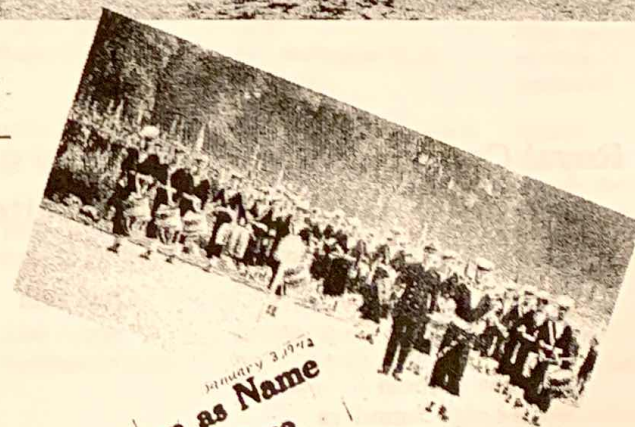

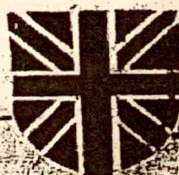
